CHHE PROJECT MAPPING OUR TEARS: OUT OF THE ATTIC!!!**

The Center for Holocaust and Humanity Education is proud to announce its latest exhibit, *Mapping Our Tears: Out of the Attic*. CHHE has been working with the Cincinnati Museum Center to recreate the permanent exhibit, *Mapping Our Tears*, experience in classrooms and schools throughout the Tri-State area.

The portable version consists of a set that replicates the comforting feel of the 'attic' atmosphere. It includes the integration of three new testimonies of local eyewitnesses who were children during the Holocaust as well as testimonies from the permanent exhibit. The testimonies are augmented by display cases full of artifacts, replicas and facsimiles of artifacts and documents pertaining to the lives of the eyewitnesses before, during, and after the Holocaust. Sound and lighting are used to enhance the testimonies.

A variety of Holocaust experiences are featured in the exhibit including:

- Henry Fenichel - imprisoned in Bergen Belsen concentration camp and sent on a rare prisoner exchange to Palestine
- Zahava Rendler – a young child hidden in a bunker and later a convent
- Sonja Stratman – participated in the Hitler youth as a child growing in Germany
- Anne Willem Meijer - participated the Dutch resistance
- Edith Carter – grew up in Czechoslovakia; was later sent to Terezin and Auschwitz
- Henry Meyer – a child prodigy on the violin who was sent to Auschwitz and liberated in Ohrdruf

Trained educators from The Holocaust Center accompany the exhibit to help students understand the historical context of the Holocaust as well as the moving lessons of perseverance and courage of the human spirit. Further, the program serves as a foundation to share messages of tolerance, compassion, survival, hope, moral development and diversity to assist students in analyzing the results of political, economic, and social oppression and violation of human rights.
