

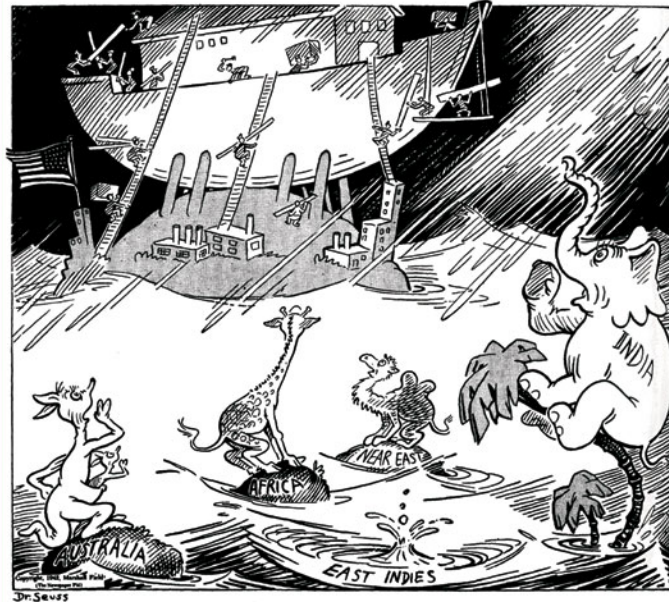

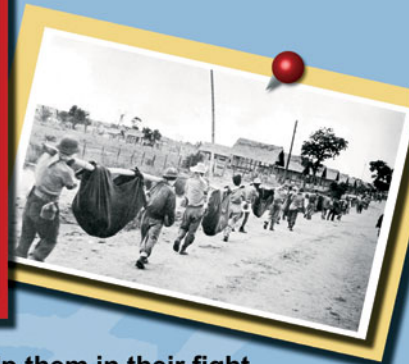

The French Resistance movement begged the U.S. to help them in their fight against the Nazi occupation forces. President Roosevelt addressed the media on March 15, 1941 and said, "Before the present war broke out on September 1, 1939, I was more worried about the future than many people....indeed, than most people. The record shows that I was not worried enough."

The Japanese military inflicted a great amount of brutality in China, Korea, the Philippines and elsewhere. One of the most infamous horrors was the "Bataan Death March" resulting in the deaths of over 10,000 American and Filipino prisoners of war. They carried the sick and the dead for 100 miles to internment camps.
