

Dr. Seuss' cartoons appeared in PM, a New York daily newspaper. Ralph Ingersoll, the editor, said that PM was "against people who push other people around... we are for people who are kindly, and courageous and honest. We are American and we prefer democracy to any other form of government."

After the war, Dr. Seuss wrote dozens of children's books. In *Yertle the Turtle* and *The Sneetches*, Dr. Seuss used lessons from WWII. His love for children and his quest for a thinking, reading public made Dr. Seuss an American hero.

Turning his beliefs into practice, Dr. Seuss joined the Signal Corps of the Army in 1943 at the age of 39. While in the Army, Seuss worked on a film series called "Why We Fight" that explains WWII to the American people. He received three Academy Awards for his documentaries.
