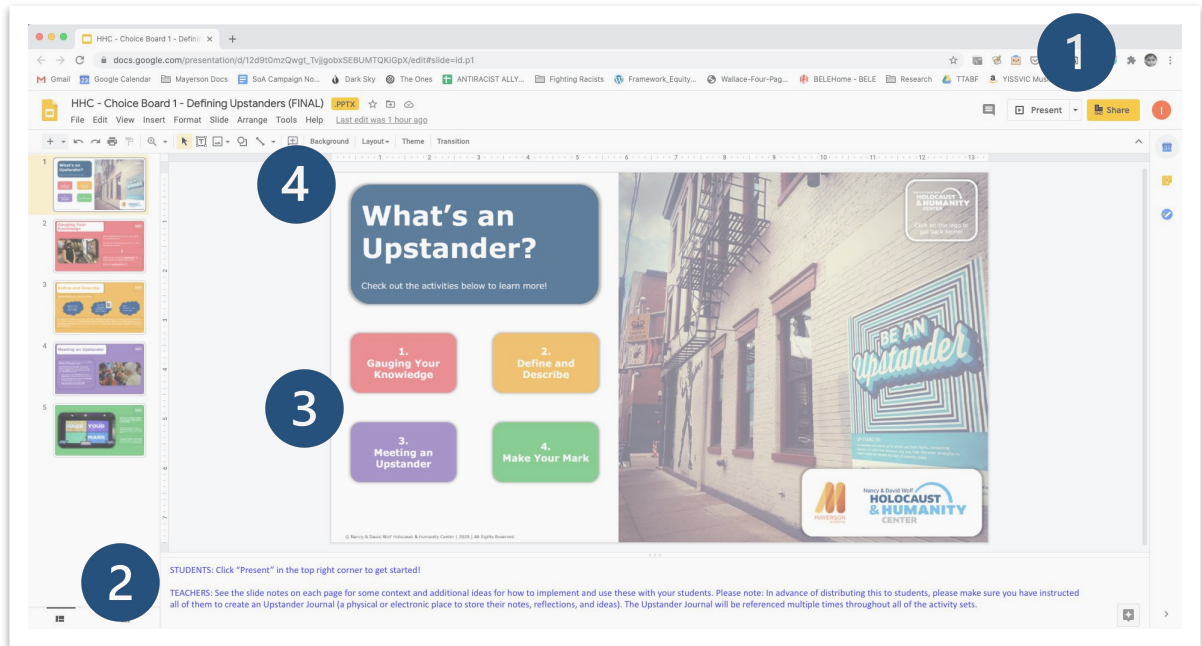


Upstander Choice Boards

See below for tips on how to use these resources with your students!



1 After clicking at the top of their screen (if it shows up), students can click the PRESENT button in the top right corner to start exploring the activities.

2 The slide notes contain ideas, framing, and recommendations for teachers to help you with facilitating classroom discussions and helping students successfully complete the activities.

3 While the home page looks slightly different for each activity set, there will always be a set of buttons that students can click to move forward. The slides should be locked in place so students can only click where they are supposed to.

4 The activities are based on HHC's mission to ensure the lessons of the Holocaust inspire action today. We explore current topics through the lens of character strengths, highlighting individuals who have or are currently making changes in our world today.

A note about Upstander Journals:

Most of the activities make reference to an **Upstander Journal**. Before distributing any of these activities to students, consider whether you want students to have a physical or electronic "journal" to record their thoughts, ideas, and reflections throughout the activities. There are pros and cons to each, but we encourage you to do whatever works best for you and your students. Physical journals are simpler to set up but harder to share, particularly if you are in remote instruction. If you pursue an electronic option, we recommend keeping it simple – consider using Google Slides so students can be creative in their work while maintaining an easy-to-share pathway.
